- 1.1 **Energy and carbon management in Cambridgeshire Schools**

An overview of the main energy and carbon management challenges facing Cambridgeshire schools, with reference to national and local policy. Practical guidance will be given on how some of these issues may be addressed.
- 1.2 **Water: Every drop matters**
